

NEW SKYBOX AT MEMORIAL ARENA



The new Ropes & Reins™ skybox, donated by the Hart Foundation, is under construction at the Cave Creek Memorial Arena. Ropes & Reins™ is located above and behind the roping chutes and will be completed for the 2026 Cave Creek Rodeo Days in March.

Ropes & Reins™ has a seating capacity of 60 guests with table seating on the lower level and drink rail seating on the upper level, with no obstruction to any seat. Visitors can enjoy the experience of a bird's-eye view of the ropers and steer wrestlers' performance, and the additional excitement of the broncs, bulls, and barrel racers come flying into the arena directly at you from bucking the chutes!

CAVE CREEK WELCOMES NEW FIRE STATION

Daisy Mountain Fire & Medical held a special grand opening of its new Fire Station #144 on the corner of 24th Street and Cloud Road on Saturday, January 10, 2026. This is the seventh station within the district service area, spanning over 250 square miles. The new station will strengthen the ability to protect lives and property by improving fire and medical coverage in the east Desert Hills and west Cave Creek service area, significantly reducing emergency response times. This station symbolizes unity and collaboration between DMFD and the Town of Cave Creek. The decision to split half of the operational costs with the Town of Cave Creek underscores the shared commitment to safeguarding the lives and property of residents across all our area communities.

PREPARE FOR WILDFIRE SEASON


The Southwest and Arizona has been in drought for more than 25 years, so the "wildfire season" is no longer a seasonal concern, but a concern for all year long. Living in the desert means we need to care for our surroundings to stay safe from wildfires. The main wildfire fuels near our homes are dried weeds and grasses that are not native to the area.

To help protect your property follow some of these simple actions:

The easiest way to save money and conserve water is to manage your water usage. Are you using too much? Do you have a leak you are not aware of?

The Cave Creek Water Portal My360 offers the following benefits:

- Create a 30-foot defensible space around your home, free of dried grass, heavy accumulations of ground litter/debris, and other highly flammable vegetation.
- Remove invasive species such as globe chamomile (AKA stinknet), buffelgrass, red brome, Malta starthistle, fiddleneck, and desert broom, which starve our native fauna of water and act as accelerants in the event of fires.
- Native shrubs are a good thing: burro-weed or white bursage, brittlebush, jojoba, creosote, and turpentine are the primary native groundcovers and help keep many of the weeds above from completely taking over the desert.
- Prune back tree limbs growing into other trees and remove branches from trees where the canopy is close to a roofline or window. Address the tree canopies in these areas by raising them to 4ft to 6ft and removing and disposing of any dead branches or limbs.

NOTABLE TOWN COUNCIL ACTIONS

All meetings start at 5:00pm in the Town Council Chambers, 37622 N. Cave Creek Road

October 2025

- Town Council authorized Town Manager to execute an agreement for the purchase of a lot with groundwater rights with Harquahala Valley Landowners, LLC

November 2025

- Approved amended Building Codes going into effect January 1, 2026
- Council approved amending Town Tax Code to increase transaction privilege tax rate on hotel and bed tax effective February 1, 2026

December 2025

- Approval intergovernmental agreement with Maricopa County for law enforcement services by Maricopa County Sheriff's Office
- Approved Community Grants awards totaling \$40,000 for 501 (c)3 non-profit organizations serving the Cave Creek and Desert Foothills communities

January 2026

- Town Council agreed to proposed increase to utility rate and structure changes for 2026 through 2028
- Council chose not to proceed in the purchase of one-acre lot from Harquahala Valley
- Council accepted the findings of the Annual Audit and Annual Comprehensive Financial Report for Fiscal Year 2024-25
- Town Council accepted recommendations of the Ad Hoc Committee on Open Space to acquire approximately 4,005 acres of Open Space

MAYOR MORRIS GIVES STATE OF THE TOWN ADDRESS

The Town of Cave Creek held its annual State of the Town address on Thursday, February 5, 2026. Mayor Robert Morris presented to approximately 100 community members about the upcoming projects and the important issues facing the Town in 2026. The presentation included a video that highlighted the accomplishments and projects by the Town in 2025.

PLANS TO REMODEL AND EXPAND TOWN HALL

When storage rooms become offices, hallways are used for storage, and every door and window is a security issue, it's time to consider changes to the Town Hall's office space. Since 2023, the Town Council has been exploring remodeling and expanding Town Hall to meet the needs of staff and the community.

Town Hall Redevelopment Timeline

Starting in 2023, the Town Council and senior staff identified a Strategic Plan initiative that the town hall needed to be evaluated for redesign and redevelopment. In 2024, Town staff engaged local architect Greg Zimmerman to evaluate the existing capacity of Town Hall and to prepare a space plan. To address the need for additional land to accommodate an expanded footprint for the town hall, the Town Council, in 2025, authorized the purchase of an adjacent vacant property immediately south of the town hall building. Later that same year, Zimmerman developed a proposed floorplan and presented it at the 2025 Town Council retreat. During the FY2026 budget discussion, Council approved a Capital Improvement Project to pay the balance owed on the vacant parcel and to fund the completion of construction drawings and the finalization of plans for a remodel and expansion of Town Hall. In 2026, Town staff moved forward with Zimmerman on the design of the remodeling and new section of Town Hall.

Town Hall Plans

To reduce construction costs, the current walls of the Town Hall building, roof, and plumbing will be utilized in the project.

- Current Town Hall is 7,750 square feet – will be remodeled (Phase 2)
- Proposed addition is 5,000 square feet – to house administrative offices (Phase 1)
- Building security is being addressed – limiting exterior access doors.
- Centralized customer service counter and lobby with public restrooms and meeting spaces to improve customer service and staff efficiency
- Additional conference room space and modular office space to accommodate future staffing changes
- Staff adjacencies will enhance interoffice communication and improve more efficient workflow
- Upgraded air-conditioning and heating systems to increase efficiency and lower heating and cooling costs
- Updated building façade and additional parking for residents and staff

The Town hired a professional outside construction estimator for the project, who estimated approximately \$5.8 million for the project. The estimate includes the construction, fixtures, furnishing, and equipment.

The Town Council will review and award the construction contract, with construction to commence on or after July 1, 2026.

LEARN ABOUT THE PROPOSED TOWN BUDGET AND TOWN HALL REMODEL

The Town of Cave Creek will hold a public information meeting on Wednesday, March 18, at 5:00 p.m. in the Town Council Chambers to answer questions about the FY27 budget and the Town Hall remodel and expansion.

Following several revision workshops with the Council, the budget is scheduled for tentative adoption by the Council in May, and the final version will be adopted in June, with implementation of the FY2027 budget on July 1, 2027.

SPRING HIKING IS HEATING UP

Each year, more than 200 people are rescued while hiking in Arizona's parks and preserves.

- You know your limits, as well as those with you. Make an informed decision on which trail to trek, and your trek will be more enjoyable.
- During the warmer months, hike during the early/late hours when temperatures are slightly cooler.
- Wear appropriate footwear, a wide-brim hat, and light-colored, loose-fitting clothing that will breathe well in the heat. Wear quality sunglasses with lenses that offer 100% UVA and UVB protection. Wear sunscreen and reapply regularly throughout your hike.
- Begin hydrating BEFORE you set out for your hike, and rehydrate frequently. Carry enough water for your entire workout. Remember to bring plenty of water for your children and canine friends. When your water is half done – turn around because you are half done!

Fun tip: Consume cold fluids during and after hiking. Flavoring your fluids may make you more likely to keep sipping. Hydro Flasks are awesome, reusable water bottles that keep fluids cold for hours. Make a 'mocktail'. Add some frozen blueberries, squeezed lemon wedges, a dash of salt, and a sprig of mint for a delicious flavor and extra electrolytes. Make sure you slap the mint with your hands so the oils are extracted!

- Stay on designated trails.
- Tell someone where you are recreating and when you expect to return.
- Turn around and return to the trailhead when your water is half gone.
- Carry a cell phone, and make sure it is fully charged.
- Don't hike alone.
- Use maps to know where you are going and what kind of terrain you are hiking on.

CAVE CREEK BIKE WEEK



CAVE CREEK TO HOLD TWO YARD WASTE DROP-OFF DAYS FOR RESIDENTS



Yard waste, such as weeds, leaves, brush, and small branches that are around your home, could be the primary source of wildfire fuel. To support the community in creating defensible space in their yards for fire prevention, the Town of Cave Creek is hosting two drop-off events for residents (only) to discard green waste. These events will occur on Saturday, March 21, and Saturday, April 18, from 8am to 12pm at the Water Ranch, located at 4300 E. Carefree Hwy.

Residents must bring proof of Cave Creek residence (either a driver's license, utility bill, addressed piece of mail) and be prepared to unload your debris in areas designated by Town staff once you arrive. Once unloaded, staff will take care of the rest.
